Local Architecture Firm Chosen to Complete Theater Study



Tevebaugh Architecture of Wilmington has been chosen to perform a conceptual study of the Fort DuPont War Department Theater. The architect was on site in January to conduct a point cloud laser survey of the theater's exterior and interior. This survey will be used to develop a 3D

model of existing conditions. The study will provide the framework for the design, ensuring consistency and coherence in all phases.

Built in 1933, Fort DuPont War Department Theater was a community resource to soldiers stationed at Fort DuPont and Delaware City residents. Closed in the 1970s, the theater's redevelopment will be a linchpin for Fort DuPont's revitalization.



Fort DuPont in the Spotlight

Fort DuPont stars in an article published in the January 2025 issue of Greenville Neighbors.

The piece, written by Will Hahn with photos by Dorie Hahn, describes how a family out for a riverside drive discovered the fort, seeing buildings for a seemingly empty mid-20th century town, including a post office, theater and chapel. The family wondered if the site was a "private school, suddenly abandoned" or a "set for a movie never filmed."

The realization that the locale had been a fort arrived after a jaunt on a nature trail past huge concrete bunkers and signs warning of "Unexploded Ordnance."

Hahn tells the fort's history as a coastal defender and writes about taking a tour with a state park's guide, who talked about plans for the fort's redevelopment and activities in 2025.
