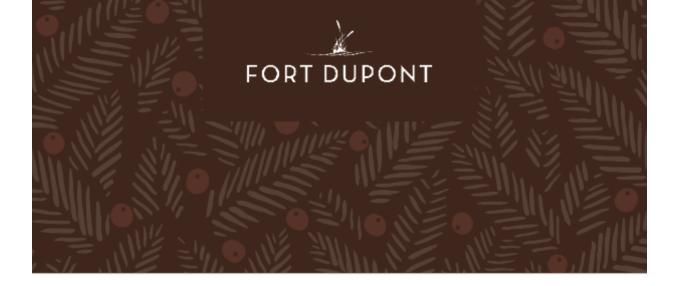
Meet: Terrance "Terry" McGovern

Board Meeting on March 12

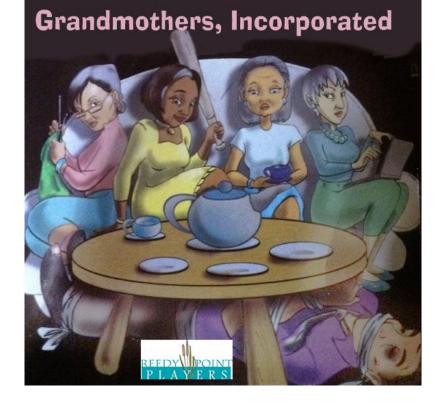
